POSITION SUMMARY:

The primary purpose of the Powerline Technician is to perform all work in connection with electrical power generation, transmission and distribution system equipment, lines, apparatus, and substations.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES & RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Installs, maintains, removes and restores (steel, wood, composite or concrete) poles, towers and structures for powerlines;
- Sets and guys poles and pulls cables;
- Installs and maintains conductors and associated equipment;
- Makes cuts and connections on low and high voltage powerlines;
- Adheres to all safety standards by following approved safe work plans; and,
- Other duties and responsibilities as assigned.

CANDIDATE PROFILE:

- Powerline Technician Trade Certification;
- Preferred 5+ years of experience working in high voltage transmission and/or distribution powerline and substation construction as a journey-certified powerline technician;
- Must be comfortable with working from heights and able to climb poles and structures of any height;
- Must be able to work in Class 2 and 3 rubber gloves and sleeves;
- Experience with hot distribution work would be considered an asset;
- Must have a safety-minded approach to performing daily tasks;
- Excellent interpersonal and verbal communication skills;
- Strong hand-eye coordination and manual dexterity;
- Valid Driver's License; and,
- Valid passport for eligibility for international emergency response assignments.
